

Wednesday June 27th 1866

Begins with moderate S.E. & thick fog. Ship under short sail working eastward through the ice. Ship Reinder in company. at 10 P.M. saw several sails to the leeward.

Thursday June 28th 1866

Begins with strong breeze from S.E. & thick fog. Latter part clear. gained with the ship Udaline. Gov. Group & Bks. Mt. Mollaston John P. West & President. Heard that the bark Daniel Wood & a french ship was stove by the ice. The Daniel Wood had five timbers broke off and seven planks stove in.

Friday June 28, 1866

Commences with moderate breeze at S.E. & thick fog. Middle and latter part light breeze and clear weather. 26 sails in sight.

Saturday June 30th

Light breeze and thick fog from S.E. Ship under short sail in the ice. Cape Behring bearing S.E. 10 mi. distant. At 10 P.M. came to anchor in 25 fathoms of water. The watch employed watering off a cake of ice.

Sunday July 1st 1866

Commences with light breeze and fine weather at N. At 1 P.M. took the anchor & made an attempt to get to the southward through the ice. At 2 A.M. came to anchor 5 miles to the eastward of Cape Behring. The ship Reinder and Bks. President, Roscoe, Nile & Jms. P. West in company. At 9 A.M. got under way and let the ship drift with the current along the land.

Monday July 2^d

Begins with light airs from west and foggy weather, several canoes filled with natives along side in the afternoon.

Tuesday July 3^d

Light airs from E.S.E. & thick fog. Ship in thick & heavy ice. At 4 P.M. anchored to the ice with boat anchors. At 5 A.M. cast off and steered S.W. at 11 A.M. cleared the ice and steered south. Bks. Anashonts in sight.

Wednesday July 4th

Light airs from E.S.E. and thick fog. at 1 P.M. gained with the Bk. Anashonts. At 2 P.M. steered to the westward along the ice.

Thursday July 5th

Light airs from S. E. and thick fog. Ship working to the eastward. Spoke the ship Janus & Bk's Anashonts & Peru.
