Begins with light breeze and fine weather at S.E. Middle & latter part strong breeze and rugged at N.S.W.

First part moderate breeze and fine weather at W.S.W. at 4 P.M. spoke the bark Kamerlune of New Bedford. at 4³⁰ P.M. Landed for a towhead. and galled him. Middle & latter part strong breeze and rugged at W.S.W. at 3.30 A.M. saw a towhead lowland and chased him four hours without success. Two sails in sight.

First part strong breeze and rugged at S.E. Hoast fig for dinner. Middle & latter part blowing strong at S.S.W. Two sails in sight.

Begins with strong wind at S.S.W. at 3 P.M. the wind hauled to N.N.W. and moderated. Middle & latter part light breeze and rainy weather at N.W. bark President of New Bedford in company.

Wednesday July 18th 1866.

Begins with light breeze and fine weather at E. gamed with the bark President. Middle & latter part fresh breeze and clear weather at N.E. Bark President in company.

Thursday July 19th

First part strong breeze and fine weather at N.W.S.W. gamed with the ship Ocean and bark President. Middle & latter strong breeze and foggy at N.W.

22 sails in sight. Lat 70.. 02 North.
Long 174.. 06 West.

Friday July 20th

Begins with strong breeze at W.S.W. several ships whaling. Middle & latter part strong breeze and foggy weather at N.N.W. 18 sails in sight.

Lat 69.. 47 North.
Long 172.. 18 West.

Saturday July 21st

Begins with light breeze and fine weather at W. all sail set steering E. Ship Gay Head of New Bedford in company.

Middle & latter part fresh breeze and fine weather at N.E. 4 sails in sight steering to the eastward.

Lat 69.. 23 North.
Long 169.. 29 West.
