

Sunday August 26th 1866

Begins with light airs and thick fog at N. commenced boiling at 4 PM. middle & latter part light breeze & thick fog. No Operation.

Monday August 27th

Begins with light breeze and thick fog at N.E. the watch employed boiling. Gained with the bark Canton Packet. middle & latter part clear weather. all of the boats down chasing whales.

Lat. 40.. 26

Long 140.. 43.

Tuesday August 28th

Begins with light airs and calms all of the boats down chasing whales. middle & latter part light breeze and fine weather. low and for whales but did not get any. finished boiling at 8 AM.

Lat 40.. 15

Long 140.. 25.

Wednesday August 29th

Begins with light breeze and fine weather at N.E. low and for whales but did not get any. 15 sails in sight, middle & latter part strong breeze. All hands employed stowing down oil. Lat 40.. 18

Long 140.. 16

B. Boat.

Thursday Aug 30th

Begins with strong breeze and clear weather at N.E. low and down and struck a bowhead. got him to the ship at 2 00 PM. Finished stowing down at 6 PM. middle part employed cutting. Latter part strong breeze started the works at 8 AM.

Lat 40.. 06

Long 140.. 36

Friday Aug 31st

Begins with strong breeze and clear weather at N.E. all hands employed boiling. Gained with bark Canton Packet. 20 ships in sight several of them a whaling. Lat 40.. 13

Long 140.. 19

Saturday September 1st

Begins with strong breeze and clear weather at N.E. all hands employed boiling. low and for whales but did not get any. middle & latter part blowing strong.

Lat 40.. 06

Long 140.. 02.

Sunday Sept 2nd

Begins with strong breeze and clear weather at N.E. All hands employed boiling. Middle and latter part, finished boiling and commenced stowing down

Monday Sept 3rd 1866

Begins with fresh breeze and clear weather at N.E. all hands employed stowing down oil. Gained with the ships Congress & Europa. Latter part employed whaling
