

Tuesday Oct 23^d

Begins with strong trades and fine weather at E. Latter part saw Oahu bearing S.W. all sail set steering S.W. B.S. all hands employed getting the cables up and sending them to Oahu.

Wednesday Oct 24th

Took the Pilot at one PM at 2 PM anchored in Honolulu Harbor

Friday Nov. 28^d 1866

Took the anchor at 12 M. and went to sea. Middle and latter part light N.E. trades. bent an upper new fore top sail.

Saturday Nov 24th

Light N.E. trades and fine weather. Ship laying off and on Honolulu I.S.

Sunday Nov 25th 1866

Light N.E. trades and fine weather. Ship laying off and on Honolulu. 7 other ships doing the same.

Monday Nov 26th

Light airs and calms. at 12 M. Capt. Soule came off bringing Mrs. Soule with him. Made sail and steered to the Eastward.

Ship St. George at sea Nov. 27th 1866

Tuesday Nov 27th

Light baffling winds. All sail set working through the passage between Oahu and Moolki. The watch employed painting the boats.

Wednesday Nov. 28th

Moderate N.E. trades and fine weather. All sail set steering N. by W. Watch employed painting boats inside. Two sail in sight.

Thursday Nov 29th

Fresh trades and fine weather. All sail set steering N. by W. The watch employed setting up the mizzen top-mast and top-gallant back stays. And fitting ~~the~~ spare boat.

Friday Nov. 30th

Light breeze and fine weather. at E. N.E. All sail set steering to North by the wind. one sail in sight.

Saturday Dec. 1st 1866

Begins with light breeze and fine weather at S.E. Middle & latter part breeze all sail set steering N.E. one sail in sight.

Sunday Dec 2^d

Begins with light breeze and fine weather at S.E. middle & latter part light breeze at E.B.N. all sail set steering by the wind.
