Monday Dec 3rd 1866

Begins with strong breeze and rain at N.E. middle & latter part moderate breeze and fine weather at S.E. the watch employed repairing the mainsail.

Tuesday Dec 4th

Begins with strong and fine weather at S.E. all sail set steering S.E. middle & latter part blowing strong at S.W. the watch employed repairing the mainsail.

Wednesday Dec 5th

First part strong breeze and cloudy at S.W. middle & latter part blowing a gale at S.W. at 10 a.m. the wind halled to the N.W. with rain squalls.

Thursday Dec 6th

First part strong breeze and rain at N.W. middle & latter part moderate breeze and fine weather at N.W.

Long 143.. 02 West.

Friday Dec 7th

Begins with moderate breeze and fine weather at N.W. middle & latter part light breeze at N.W.S.

Islands to coast of California. Dec. 7. 66

Saturday Dec 8th 1866

Begins with light breeze and fine weather at N.S.W. middle and latter part light breeze at N.W.S. all set steering S.E. the day employed rigging the boats. Mother has been on deck nearly all day. Saw Finbacks.

Sunday Dec 9th

First part light air from W to N.S.W. middle & latter part light breeze and fine weather at S.W. All sail set steering S.E.

Lat 31.. 14 North.

Long 138.. 29 West.

Monday Dec 10th

Commences with light breeze at S.W. middle & latter part strong breeze and fine weather at W.

Lat 31.. 16 North

Long 135.. 00 West

Tuesday Dec 11th

First part blowing a gale at N.W. ship under reefed topsails and foresail steering S.E. middle and latter part strong breeze and fine weather. Mother is sea sick to day.
