

Ship St George San Deminten Bay.

Sunday march 3^d 1867.

Strong breeze and thick fog at N.W. All the boats out whaling, came in at 3⁰⁰ P.M. on account of the weather.

Monday march 4th

Moderate land and sea breeze. The boats all out whaling got one to the 2^d mate of the fish Perry. Shot one to the starboard boat of the fish Perry. Greeners Sam. the line got foul and lost him.

Tuesday March 5th

Strong sea breeze at N.W. All the boats out whaling, saw very few whales. The shipkeepers employed on board the fish Perry cutting the whale.

Wednesday March 6th

Light land and sea breeze. All the boats out whaling. The starboard went on to a gam of whales and the boatsteerer missed them.

Thursday March 7th

Strong sea breeze. All the boats out whaling. got one to the west boat of the fish Perry and one to the starboard boat. Greeners Sam. got them to the Ships at sundown. Took Mason (the boatsteerer) that missed the whale yesterday out of the boat and put Agus Smith one of the men forward in his place.

1867

Coast of California March.
Friday March 8th 1867.

Light land and sea breeze. The boats all out whaling. the shipkeepers employed cutting. got whales to the starboard boat of the fish Perry. Greeners Sam. and to the west boat of the St George.

Saturday March 9th

Light breeze and fine weather at S.E. the shipkeepers and one boat crew employed cutting. Started the works at 1 P.M. and sent the boat out. got whales to the starboard and starboard boats of the St George.

Sunday March 10th

Strong breeze and rain at S.E. cooled down at 6 A.M. all hands employed cutting finished at 8 A.M. the boats went out, the weather being bad came in at 12 M.

Monday, 11th

Strong breeze at N.W. The boats out whaling. saw very few whales. the shipkeepers employed hauling.

Tuesday 12th

Strong breeze at N.W. All the boats out whaling. finished hauling at 11³⁰ A.M. At 11³⁰ A.M. the Carpenter fell down the fore hatch and broke his collar bone.
