

Ship St George in port at S. Is.
Thursday April 4th

Strong trades. At 3 a.m. dragged our anchor into deep water 50 fathoms of chain out. it took us two hours to haul it in. Came in with the sea breeze at 9 A.M. the remainder of the day employed washing ship and painting.

Friday April 5th

Strong sea breeze and fine weather. The day employed painting ship and getting potatoes. At 6 P.M. hove in 35 fathoms of chain and got ready for sea. got under weigh at 10 P.M. with a light land breeze.

Saturday April 6th

Strong S.E. trades and fine weather all sail set steering N.W.B.W. five islands in sight at 4 P.M. saw Moohoo bearing N.W.W. 25 miles distant. Landed three boats at 5 P.M. for a sperm whale which turned out to be a humpback. Ship laying to under short sail. Lat 20..35 North.

Long 157..31 West.

Sunday April 7th

Strong trades and fine weather. Took the Pilot at 7 A.M. at 8 A.M. anchored in Honolulu harbor. All hands shore on liberty.

Ship St George in port of Honolulu.
Monday April 8th 1867.

All hands employed sending down the foretopmast on painting bents and getting ready for fresh water. The carpenters came on board with a new set of cast iron pumps.

Tuesday April 9th

Brisk trades and clear weather. employed sending up a new foretopmast. the carpenters on board putting in the new pumps.

Wednesday April 10th

Employed sending up topsail yards foretopgallant mast &c. at 5 P.M. took the anchor and hauled to the wharfe to discharge oil.

Thursday April 11th

Employed discharging oil.

Friday April 12

Employed getting wood and water and provisions. At 2 P.M. took the Pilot and came out.

Saturday April 13

Strong trades and fine weather ship under short sail laying off and on Honolulu
