Monday April 22^d

Light breeze and clear
weather at NW. All sail set steering

the boats and painting them.

Lat 25.. 21 North

Long 164.. 13 West

Tuesday April 23^d

Light breeze and clear
weather at NW. All sail set steering
by the wind. Employed taking
the starboard bowboat in ~~and~~ ⁱⁿ repair
head, painting her and the spare boats.
Put Lyman Hozde a traitor in
irons, and in the Run for insulting
the Captain. At 6:30 P.M. tacked
ship and steered NE by the wind.

Wednesday April 24th

Light breeze and fine
weather at NW. All sail set
steering by the wind. Employed
breaking out small stores and giving
out rations. No Observations.
