

Ship H George off Cape Behring. 1867
Saturday June 1st

Begins with strong breeze with snow squalls at ESE loward for whales but without success. 8 sails in sight. Latter part strong breeze and foggy ship under short sail beating up along the land. No Observation.

Sunday June 2^d

First part light breeze and fine weather at SE. made sail and steered by the wind. Middle & latter part light breeze and fine weather at W. B. all sail set steering E. B. The Esquimaux aboard trading. Seven sails in sight most of them a sailing. Cape Agchen bearing N. 10 miles distant. No Observation.

Monday June 3

Begins with light breeze and thick fog at W. at 4 P.M. the fog cleared away saw whales loward and chased. Middle part thick fog anchored off Cape Agchen in 35 fathoms of water. Latter part thick fog and light air at W. Took the anchor at 11 A.M. made sail and steered by the wind. No Observation.

Tuesday June 4

Begins with light breeze and clear weather at W. all sail set steering E. B. N. five sail in sight. Gained with the bark John Wells. Latter part light breeze and fine weather at E. loward for whales but did not get any. spoke the ship gaz head of New Bedford. all sail set beating up along the land to the Eastward of Plover Bay.

Ship H George in Behring straits
Wednesday June 5

Begins with light airs and calms saw whales did not get any natives on board. latter part light breeze and fine weather at SE all sail set steering by the wind. Indian point bearing N. E. 10 miles dist. 6 sails in sight. No Observation.

Thursday June 6

Begins with fresh breeze and foggy at SE all sail set steering N. B. E. Natives along side trading. at 6:30 P.M. shortened sail and heeled to the eastward by the wind. middle & latter part strong breeze and foggy saw quite a number of whales loward and struck one got him to the ship at 3 A.M. finished cutting at 7:30 A.M. spoke the brig Cohoe of Bremen. No Observation.

Friday June 7

Begins with strong breeze and foggy at SW saw plenty of whales loward but the fog shut in and we lost run of them. at 8 P.M. saw whales loward down and struck one got him to the ship at 12 o'clock and commenced cutting finished at 5 A.M. Latter part saw plenty of whales loward and struck one got him along side at 11 A.M. three ships in sight.
