Ship St George on a whale voyage to the Arctic Ocean

Tuesday July 2^d

First part light breeze and fine weather at S.E. all sail set steering N.W. gamed with the ships Florida of San Francisco, Bark Robert Towns of Sydney Ship George Howland & bark Stephania of New Bedford. middle & latter part light breeze and thick fog ship lying at anchor.

No Observation.

Wednesday July 3rd

First part light breeze and thick fog at N.E. at 4 P.M. the fog cleared away saw 7 sails. Latter part light breeze and fine weather. spoke the barks Progress & Lydia of New Bedford.

Long 173.. 46

Thursday July 4th

First part fresh breeze and fine weather at N.E. 11 sails in sight lying off and on the ice. gamed with the ship Sag Head of New Bedford. saw one tomhead along the edge of the ice. middle part employed chasing whales. Latter: strong breeze and clear. gamed with the bark Cicero of New Bedford and spoke bark Robert Towns of Sydney.

Friday July 5th

Begins with a strong breeze and clear weather at N.E. saw several whales. three were struck today two of them lost in the ice. Latter part moderate breeze and thick fog.

Ship St George of New Bedford in the Arctic Ocean

Saturday July 6. 1867.

Begins with moderate breeze and foggy at N.E. middle part thick fog. Latter part light breeze and cloudy all sail set lying off and on the ice. spoke the bark J.D. Thompson of New London. Lat 69.. 48 North. Long 173.. 41 West.

Sunday July 7.

Begins with fresh breeze and cloudy at S.E. 20 sails in sight beating along the ice. middle & Latter part light breeze and fine weather. gamed with the ship Jereh Perry and barks Three Brothers & C. Swift of New Bedford.

Lat 69.. 38 North

Monday July 8

Begins with fresh breeze and fine weather at S.E. Latter part light breeze and foggy at N.W. employed cruising in thin ice.

No Observation.

Tuesday July 9.

Begins light breeze and foggy at N.W. ship under short sail cruising in the ice. at 7 P.M. worked out of the ice. into clear water. spoke the ship Julian of Bremen. Latter part fresh breeze and fine weather. saw one whale, 6 sails in sight. No Observation.

Wednesday July 10

First part light breeze and foggy at N.W. gamed with the bark Lydia. middle & Latter part strong breeze and thick fog ship lying too under short sail.
