

Log. Ship S^t. George of New Bedford.

Sunday October 29th 1865

At 9 o'clock it M got under way and steered to the South West down the Bay at meridian the Pilot left us in a boat from the ship Janus (bound in) at 2 P.M. Nomans Land Bearing N East Dist 12 miles

Monday October 30th 1865

The first part Strong winds from N.W. and clear weather at 1 A.M. passed close to a Brig that was steering S by E. the middle of the day strong breeze from North all sail set steering S.E. by E. saw a ship steering to the S. & the latter part a moderate breeze from S by N. and cloudy weather at sundown took in Top Gal - lant Sails & fly jib Saw black fish, ~~several~~ empty fitting Boats

Long by Acct 68.38 West

Tuesday October 31st 1865

Commenced with moderate winds from E.S.E. with occasional calms Ship working to the Eastward, the latter part Strong winds from E.S.E. all hands employed fitting Boats

Sat by Obs 38.23 N.

Long by Chron 66.37 W

Wednesday November 1st 1865

Commences with strong winds from S East. and cloudy weather Ship steering E.N.E. by the wind at 3 P.M. Reefed the Top sails took in the Mainsail & jib

broke the Barrow forward, to the Starboard Boat, ~~the~~ (house, rotten wood) the latter part moderate winds from S by E. all sail set steering East
