Commenced with strong winds from S.W. and squalls of rain all sail set steering S.E. & saw a sail steering to the Southward the middle a moderate breeze from N.W. ends with a moderate breeze from N.N.E.

Friday November 3rd 1865

The first four hours a light breeze from East, all hands employed fitting Boats putting on chafing gear &c; from 4 P.M. till 3 A.M. calm, the latter part a moderate breeze from S.S.E. hauling gradually to the S.W. Ship steering to the Eastward, Rove New Fore Braces, King and Duty again

Saturday November 4th 1865

Strong breeze from West and fine weather all sail set steering S.E. by E. all hands employed Breaking out, making Boat sails & fitted the Cutting Sendants,

Light breezes from S.W. and fine weather all sail set steering S.E. by East. Saw a Brig steering East, and a ship steering N.W.

Tuesday November 7th 1865

Commenced with light breezes from S.W. and fine weather all sail set steering S.E. by E. all hands employed making Boat sails and fitting rigging, lashed up the Head Baring fore & Aft, saw three sail

Wednesday November 8th 1865

Commenced with strong breezes from S.E. by E. and clear weather all sail set steering S by W. at 3 A.M. tacked Ship heading N.E. all hands employed fitting Boat sails three sail in sight filled the Cutting Tails for leaving

Thursday November 9th 1865

Begins with moderate breezes from S.E. and clear weather at 2.15 P.M. saw Sperm Whales, at 3 P.M. lowered three Boats, got too the Whales just as they were going down and gallied them darted from the Waist & Starboard Boats without success, at Sundown came on board the latter part a strong breeze from E.S.E. with a heavy swell from the same quarter
