Strong Trades from N by N.
all sail set Steering S by E. & S. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. at 7 A.M.
passed close to the British Ship *Clyde* of Liverpool
the Watch employed Breaking out Water &c.

Long by Chron 25 34 W.

Tuesday Nov 28th /65

Strong North East Trades
and clear weather all sail set Steering S by E.
at Sundown the Island of St. Antone in sight
Bearing S by S. Dist 35 miles. got becalmed
under the lee of it for an hour two sail in sight
during the time the latter part strong winds from
East took in the Studding Sails and Topgal-
lant Sails

Long by Chron 24.45 West

Wednesday Nov 29th /65

Commences with Strong
N.E. Trades, and cloudy weather all sail set
Steering S S E. at 3 P.M. the Island of Brava
in sight. Bearing S S E. Dist 18 miles. Steered
S $\frac{1}{2}$ West to clear the Island the latter part Strong
Trades Ship Steering S E by S. the watch employed
moving the Capstern abaft the After Watch

Thursday Nov 30th 1865

Fresh N.E. Trades and cloudy
weather all sail set Steering S E by S. the Watch
employed fitting Shifting Boards in the Coal Hole
putting chafing gear &c

Long by Chron 21 25 West

Ship St George of New Bedford bound South Dec/65
Friday Decem^r 1st 1865

Begins with moderate breeze
from N N E. and cloudy weather one sail in sight
at 11 P.M. called all hands to take in sail, got all in
without Damage the latter part squally

Lat by Act 8.00 North
Long by Act 21 35 West

Saturday Decem 2nd /65

Commences with light
Winds from S S E. and light rain squalls the latter
part a moderate breeze from S E. and clear weather
the Watch employed picking over Potatoes

Lat by Obs 6.12 North
Long by Chron 20 48 West

Sunday Decem 3rd /65

Commences with light breeze
from S E. and cloudy weather, the middle very
light with calms, the latter part squally with
rain, wind from E. to S E. Ship Steering to the South
one sail in sight.

Lat by Obs 4.58 North
Long by Act 21 00 West

Monday December 4th /65

All these 24 hours light airs
and calms with frequent squalls of rain all sail
set to the airs trying to work South. one sail in sight
Campbell. Mr Intyre returned to Duty today, he
having been sick with the Venereal Disease since
the 2nd of November, off duty all the time

Tuesday Decem 5th /65

Light airs from S S E. and
fine weather all sail set Steering S W. by the wind
