Moderate S E Trades and
fine weather all sail set steering S W by S. S.
the Watch employed fitting new Fore Brace
Pendants, used up 45 fathoms of new inch and
three quarter Rope for yard Arm gaskets to
Top sail & Lower yards carried away Topmast &
Studding sail yard, used a Topgallant Studd-
ding Sail Boom to make another. Saw 4 sail
exchanged Signals with one, supposed it to be
the Courier of New Bedford

The first part moderate
breezes from E S E. and fine weather all sail set
steering S W by S. ore sail in sight the Watch
employed coiling ^{lines} making covers &c

at meridian luffed to the wind for a breach, it proved
to be Humphreys
