Commences with strong
breezes from S. S. E. and fine weather all sail set
steering to the S. W. after 4 o'clock bent the sails
over on the Main & Mizzen Masts the middle and
latter part strong breezes from S. E. to E. S. E.
at 7 A. M. luffed too far Spouts saw nothing more
of it and kept the Ship on her course again

Strong breezes from E. and
clear weather all sail set steering S. W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. the latter
part a moderate breeze from N. E. and fine weather

Tuesday Decem 26th /65

The first part a moderate
breeze from North, and clear weather all sail
set steering S. W. at 2 A. M. the wind hauled to
the S. W. the latter part strong winds from that
quarter, ship under reefed Topsails courses & jib
steering S. S. E. by the wind

Wednesday Decem 27th /65

Begins with strong double
reef Topsails breezes and clear rugged weather from
S. W. by S. Ship under reefed Topsails steering S. E. by S.
by the wind, the middle moderate the latter part
calm saw Finbacks.

Thursday Decem 28th /65

Begins with strong breezes
from N. N. W. and clear weather all sail set steering
S. W. by West at meridian took in Topgallant
sails & fly jib

Friday Decem 29th /65

Begins with a heavy squall of
rain from S. S. W. took in the upper Topsails and
furled the Main sail & jib at 2 P. M. the weather
cleared up made sail again to Main Topgallant
sail & fly jib the middle strong winds from
S. W. by W. Ship heading S. by E. under Topsails
& courses. the latter part light gales from S. S. W.
veered ship to the Westward under reefed
Topsails courses & jib
