

Ship St. George off Cape Horn, bound West, Jan 1866
Tuesday January 16th /66

Begins with strong breeze from W. and cloudy weather all sail set steering S by E. at 5 P.M. passed 8 miles to the Eastward of Cape St. John's, one sail in sight the middle and latter part a moderate breeze from N. Ship steering S by W ends with a puff from SSW.

Lat by Act 56.10 S.

Long. " 66 00 W

Wednesday January 17th /66

Begins with a strong wind from SSW. Ship heading to the S.E. by the wind at 3 P.M. the wind hauled to the N.E. light at 6 P.M. got a heavy squall of hail rain thunder & lightning from the Westward took in everything but the Lower Top Sail, it lasted for half an hour, when the wind hauled in to the N.E. light and remained there until 4 P.M. when it hauled to the West a light gale ship steering to the S.W.

Thursday Jan 18th /66

Commences with fresh gales from W.N.W. and cloudy weather, ship under close reefed Topsails and courses jib & Spanker heading S.W. saw a ship steering to the N.E.

Friday January 19th /66

Begins with light airs from W. and clear weather the middle a moderate breeze from West by N. all sail set at 3 P.M. tacked to the N.W. at 9 P.M. tacked to the South tacked to the N.W. again at 3 A.M.

Ship St. George off Cape Horn January 1866
Saturday January 20th /66

Begins with light airs from W.S.W. and fine weather all sail set working to the Westward the middle part calm, the latter part light airs from S.S.E. at 5 P.M. set the Ensign for a French ship.

Long 69.01 W.

Sunday January 21st /66

The first and middle part strong breezes from W.S.W. ship steering N.W. by the wind, the latter part strong winds from N.W. at 2 A.M. tacked to the S.W. one sail in sight ends with a light gale at 6 P.M. the Diego Ramirez Islands, bearing N.E. dist 35 miles Lat 57.07 S.

Long 71.34 W.

Monday January 22nd /66

Begins with light gales from N.W. and cloudy weather ship under close reefed Topsails and storm Staysails & Main & Spencer heading W.S.W. the middle strong gales from N.W. took in the Fore top sail the latter part moderate gales with squalls set the Fore top sail.

Lat 57.46 S

Long 73.47 W.

Tuesday Jan 23rd /66

Strong gales from N.W. and squally weather, ship under Lower fore & main Topsails and storm sails steering S.W. by the wind.

Lat 59.08 S

Long 74.38 W.
