Light winds from South and fine weather all sail set steering N by E 1/2 E. nothing in sight put the Bow Boat on the cranes

Moderate winds from S.S.E. and fine weather, all sail set steering N by E 1/2 E. saw several pieces of Squid

Moderate winds from S.S.E. and fine weather all sail set steering N by E. at 5 A.M. the Island of Massafura in sight bearing N 1/2 E Dist 40 miles, at 9 A.M. spoke the Bark Hecla of New Bedford

Friday February 9th /66

Moderate breezes from South and fine weather at 1 P.M. sent two Boats in to the Island of Massafura fishing at 5 they returned having caught about 150 lb of fish at 7 P.M. spoke the Bark Islander of New Bedford at 10 P.M. steered N. at 11 A.M. the Island of Massafura in sight bearing South Dist 65 miles
