

Log of Ship St. George of New Bedford. in the ice Anaidler Sea
Thursday June 28th /66

Strong winds from S.E. and thick fog made an attempt to get to the S.E. through the ice but had to give it up as a bad job the ice was so thick and heavy the latter part clear, gamed with the Ship Adaline and Mount Wadston of N. Bedford. Cape Behring. S. by E. Dist 10 miles. heard that the Bark Daniel Wood and a French Ship were stove by the ice the Daniel Wood had five Timbers broke off and 7 plank stove in

Friday June 29th /66

Moderate breezes from S.E. and thick the middle light winds and tolerable clear weather gamed with the Ships Adaline and Mt. Wadston of New Bedford. Ship banging about among the ice under reefed top sails jib & Spanker it cleared up this morning and there was 26 sail in sight the ice is still driving into the Bay where the Ships are so that the open water we had two days ago is getting filled up with ice

Saturday June 30th /66

Light winds from S.E. and foggy weather ship under short sail in the ice Cape Behring bearing S.E. Dist 10 miles. at 10 P.M. came to Anchor with the Kedge in 25 fathom of water, the Watch waterings Ship of a cake of ice

Ship St. George of New Bedford off Cape
Sunday July 1st /66

Commenced with light breezes from West and fine weather at 1 P.M. took the Anchor and made an attempt to get through the ice to the Southward, but found it so heavy that we gave it up and tried it in close to the land at 2 P.M. came to Anchor with the Kedge, 5 miles to the Eastward of Cape Behring, the Ship Reindeer, and the Barks President, Roscoe, Nile, and John P. West, in company. at 9 A.M. got under way and let the Ship drift with the current along the land

Monday July 2nd /66

Begins with light airs from West and foggy weather all sail set steering to the S.E. along the land several Canoes filled with Natives alongside during the afternoon, at 9 P.M. the Ship being 2 miles South of Cape Ashton, the wind hauled to the S.E. (ahead) so that we were obliged to come to an Anchor or head off shore in the heavy ice, we chose the latter alternative and we are now blocked in solidly, the John P. West is within half a mile of us

Tuesday July 3rd /66

Light airs from E.S.E. and thick fog Ship in heavy ice at 4 P.M. Anchored to the ice with Boat Anchors. at 5 A.M. cast off from the ice and steered to the S.W. at 11 A.M. got clear of the ice and steered South

Wednesday July 4th /66

Light airs from E.S.E. and thick fog at 1 P.M. gamed with the Bark Awshanks of New Bedford at 2 P.M. steered to the Westward along the ice at 6 A.M. hauled aback
