Tuesday Decm 18th/66

Light Winds from from N.W.
and fine weather. Through the night the ship
lying off and on San Quintens Bay. at 2 P.M.
came to Anchor in 8 fathom Water. and the
Captain and myself went in and soundled
and Bouyed the Channel to the inner Harbor.

Wednesday Decm 19th/66

Light Land and Sea Breezes
at 7 A.M. got under way and run into the inner
Harbor and came to Anchor in 5 fathom Water
at 5 P.M. Smoked Ship at

Thursday Decm 20th/66

Light Land and Sea breezes
all Hands employed setting up the Mizzen and
Mizzen Topmast Rigging sent one Boat after clams
and she returned with about 10 Bushel the Fisherman
returned without having caught anything.

Friday Decm 21st/66

Light Land and a strong sea breezes
with damp foggy weather employed Staying Mizzen Top-
Mast & Topgallant Masts. Setting up Main Topmast &
Topgallant Rigging &c. sent one Boat off after fish
she returned with^a enough for a Mess.
to day the bar across the Passage was covered with Breakers
at Low Water.

Saturday Decm 22nd/66

Strong winds from N.W. and thick
foggy weather. with fine Rain set up the St. & Mast
Rigging. Bobstays and Bowsprit Shrouels.

Sunday Decm 23rd/66

Light winds from N.W. and thick weather
nothing going on

Monday Decm 24th/66

Light Land and sea breezes and fine weather
sent the Waist and Bow Boats out to look for Whales
they saw seven took one to the Waist Boat, at 9 P.M. got him
to the ship, the Larboard & Starboard Boats on Board,
employed setting up Rigging

Tuesday Decm 25th/66

Light Land & Sea breezes with fine
weather & Boats off Whaling. the Captain cut the Whale
he got yesterday with the Ship keepers
the Boats saw several Whales but the wind was too light
to get on them

Wednesday Decm. 26th/66

Light Wind from East and fine
weather three Boats off Whaling. the Ship Jack Perry
came in today and Anchored close to us,
the hands on board employed scrubbing Ship and
Boiling Oil

Thursday Decm 27th/66

Light Land and sea Breezes
three Boats off Whaling. took one to the Larboard Boat
finished Boiling

Friday Decm 28th/66

Strong winds from North and rugged
weather three Boats started off Whaling, but they found it
so rugged outside that they returned and helped cut
in the Whale
