

Ship St George of New Bedford, at St. Vincens Bay, California  
Wednesday Feb. 6<sup>th</sup> /67

Light airs from SW to NW and  
fine weather, 4 Boats out, saw three Whales going North  
and one going South.

Thursday Feb 7<sup>th</sup> /67

Strong land and sea breezes, the  
wind blowing by fits and starts,  
4 Boats out at the Mouth of the Harbor looking for  
Whales, saw half a Dozen.

Today Captain Soule and Captain Green, of the  
Ship Jereh Perry, came to the conclusion to mate the  
Ships for the rest of the season, the Jereh Perry, to take  
one Hundred Barrels to the St. Georges Ninety five  
that being considered as compensation for the use of  
the Jereh Perrys, Greeners Gun. If the Ships get  
more than Six Whales, the Seventh is to be taken  
by the Jereh Perry, it being an average Bull Whale and  
no other percentage allowed, each Ship to have  
the same quantity in dividing the Oil. Minus an average  
Bull Whale, which is to go to the Jereh Perry.

Friday Feb 8<sup>th</sup> /67

Light land, and strong sea breezes.  
Both Ships Boats out Whaling, saw Six Whales  
Placed Bouys for the Boats to lay to

Saturday Feb 9<sup>th</sup> /67

Light land and sea breezes,  
all the Boats out Whaling, saw fifteen or twenty  
Whales all going quick to the North

Ship St George of New Bedford at St. Vincens Bay, Coast of California  
Sunday Feb 11<sup>th</sup> /67

Light land, and strong sea breezes,  
three Boats from each Ship chasing Whales, and two fishing  
saw 11 Whales going quick to the North

Monday Feb 11<sup>th</sup> /67

Light Land, and strong sea breezes  
all the Boats out Whaling saw a few Whales going quick to  
the North

Tuesday Feb 12<sup>th</sup> /67

The first part a light breeze from East  
the latter part strong winds from NW and rugged  
weather, saw six Whales

Wednesday Feb 13<sup>th</sup> /67

A light gale from NW, with heavy squalls  
of hail, all the Boats on board, too rugged to whale

Thursday Feb 14<sup>th</sup> /67

Light land and sea breezes  
the Boats all out chasing Whales, the Mate of the  
Jereh Perry, fired and missed with his Greeners Gun  
saw a number of Whales, but they were going quick to the  
North, and were well off shore

Friday Feb 15<sup>th</sup> /67

Moderate Land and sea breezes  
the Boats out chasing Whales, took one (2<sup>nd</sup> mate of the  
Jereh Perry) and at sundown had him along side  
the Ship Jereh Perry and cut in, 4 Boats Whaling  
all the time. In the morning Captain Soule, took  
the Shipkeepers and went about 12 miles up the Lagoon  
to some salt pans, and got about 300 Wt. of salt
