

Ship St. George and Jereh Perry - mated: at St. Lourens Bay  
Sunday March 10<sup>th</sup> /67

The first part light winds from S.E. and drizzling rain at daylight it cleared up and in the Whale we got yesterday. at 9 A.M. lowered the Boats and went outside but had to come in again in two hours on account of the weather

Monday March 11<sup>th</sup> /67

Strong breeze from N.W. and clear weather the Boats all out Whaling saw but few Whales

Tuesday March 12<sup>th</sup> /67

Strong winds from N. to N.W. and clear weather, all the Boats out chasing Whales saw but few. Today, Samuel C. Brown, Carpenter, fell down the fore Hatch and broke his collar bone and otherwise injured himself - finished Boiling

Wednesday March 13<sup>th</sup> /67

Strong breezes from N.W. and clear weather. Three Boats went out Whaling but returned at 12 o'clock, having saw but few Whales. Stowed 150 barrels of Oil Between Decks.

Thursday March 14<sup>th</sup> /67

Moderate breezes from N.W. and fine weather 2 Boats from each ship out Whaling very few Whales passing. Stowed down the remainder of the Oil (75 barrels) in the After Hold. cleaned Ship

Friday March 15<sup>th</sup> /67

Strong N.W. winds and clear weather 4 Boats out Whaling, took a Whale to the Waist Boat of the Jereh Perry, cut it here  
Ship cleaned and ready for Sea

Saturday March 16<sup>th</sup> /67

Moderate winds from N.W. and fine weather, employed Boiling. 4 Boats out Whaling saw but two or three Whales, the Boats returned at 2 o'clock having sounded and buoyed the Channel and got the Ship ready for Sea.

Sunday March 17<sup>th</sup> /67

Light winds from N. to N.W. and fine weather at 7 A.M. got under way and stood to sea, in company with the Jereh Perry. devided the Oil with her from the last Whale

Monday March 18<sup>th</sup> /67

Light winds from S.S.W. and cloudy weather the middle drizzling rain at 11 P.M. tack to the Westward the latter part clear, with wind to the Westward, Ship steering S.S.W. employed cleaning Ship the Ship Jereh Perry in sight.

Light airs from W. to S.W. and cloudy weather all sail set steering to the Southward by the wind. All hands employed cleaning Ship.
