

Ship St George of New Bedford of Cape Bering June 1/1862

Saturday June 1st

Commenced Heavy moderate breeze from S E Cruising of Cape Bering several ships in sight & boiling & P M lowered fore a whale did not see him again came on board hoisted up Middle part tacking off and on Cape Bering latter part the same

Sunday June 2nd

Commenced Heavy moderate breeze from E Cruising off and on Cape Bering Middle part the same latter part calm several ships in sight one cutting & boiling

Monday June 3rd

Commenced Heavy light variable Winds steering to the Eastward along the land 7 P M Cape Bering bore N W distant 7 Miles Middle part calm strong Current setting to the Eastward 2 A M saw a whale going quick to the Eastward latter part calm 12 M Cape Acher bore N distant 5 Miles

Tuesday June 4th

Commenced Heavy light variable Winds steering to the Eastward along the land & P M saw a whale going to the Eastward lowered & boats could not get on 7 P M Foggy came on board, 10 P M came to with boat & anchors in 30 fathoms reared away 20 fathoms line Middle and latter part calm and foggy 11 A M light stars from S and Heavy saw two ships steering to the Eastward Healed up anchor set all sail steering to the Eastward

Wednesday June 5th

Commenced Heavy light variable Winds steering to the Eastward along the land in company with the John Wells and Oriole 7 P M saw several ships to the Eastward Capt Dean of barque John Wells came on board 10 P M returned to his ship & ship cutting to the Eastward Middle part calm latter part light breeze from S E Working along the land to the Eastward 14 ships in sight several boiling 10 A M saw a whale going quick to E lowered & boats could not strike came on board 12 M Flower bay bore N distant 8 Miles

Thursday June 6th

Commenced Heavy light breeze from S E Working to the Eastward along the land in company with two ships & P M calm saw a whale in shore lowered & boats shot in thick fog came on board Middle and latter part calm and foggy

Friday 7th

Commenced Heavy moderate breeze from S steering to N E along the land 2 P M Indian Point bore N distant 4 Miles natives alongside & ships in sight Middle part 7 P M foggy buffed to the Eastward by the wind latter part 10 A M saw ship heading SW 2 A M saw quite a number of whales lowered & boats starboard boat struck 3 A M took him alongside and commenced cutting finished at 7.30 A M spoke the Brig Cochola of Honolulu
