Whale lower'd & boats came in thick fog came on board
Middle and latter part foggy

Sunday June 30

Commenced Hazy and brisk breeze from N.E.
Working to the N. by the Wind P.M. spoke and gassed the
barque President & P.M. saw Whales mated and lower'd
& boats from each ship could not strike & P.M.
returned to the ship Middle part light breeze
from S. with fog Latter part the same several ships
in sight
