

Ship St George of New Bedford in the Arctic August 13

Thursday August 13<sup>th</sup>

Commenced Hazy fresh breeze from E  
S E heading S under Topsails Middle part fresh breeze  
With sleet from E working to S E under Topsails Latter part  
the same 20 ships in sight

Friday August 16<sup>th</sup>

Commenced With fresh breeze from E working  
to S E under Topsails Middle part the same Latter  
part 4 A M wind veered to N with snow squalls bore  
up steering W S W 7 A M saw Herald's Islands bearing N  
by S plenty of ice to the W of us several ships in sight  
two of them Whaling

Saturday August 17<sup>th</sup>

Commenced Hazy Moderate breeze from  
N W standing off and on the ice Herald's Islands in sight  
bearing N by S distant 10 miles 4 P M saw a Whale bow  
4 boats galied him came on board hoisted up several lines  
in sight Middle and Latter part fresh breeze from N W  
with fog and snow 5 A M saw a Whale bow 4 boats  
did not see him again Come on board hoisted up and  
doubled reefed the Topsails

Sunday August 18<sup>th</sup>

Commenced With strong breeze with fog and  
snow lying to off the ice under doubled reef 4 P M  
Hazy saw Herald's Island bearing S W bore up steering S  
7 P M fresh breeze from N with snow squalls bore to off the  
ice Herald's Island bearing N 15 ships in sight Middle  
and Latter part the same 10 A M spoke the  
barge Eugene of New Bedford Capt Barnes came  
on board 11 A M returned to his ship

Ship St George of New Bedford in the Arctic August 14

Monday August 15<sup>th</sup>

Commenced With thick snow storm and fresh  
breeze from N W lying to off the ice under short sail  
1 P M spoke barge Courser bore up steering E by S  
set all sail Middle and latter part the same  
7 A M spoke ship Ohio of New Bedford

Tuesday August 20<sup>th</sup>

Commenced Hazy Moderate breeze  
from N steering to the N E all sail 6 P M saw  
Heavy ice to the S E bore up steering S 11 P M  
hauled up steering E N E Middle part fresh  
breeze from N Stowed light sails Latter part  
more moderate set all sail heading E N by the  
wind

Wednesday August 21<sup>th</sup>

Commenced Hazy Moderate breeze  
from N steering E N E by the wind all sail set  
Middle and Latter part Moderate breeze from N E  
with snow squalls working to the N all sail set  
three ships in sight

Thursday August 22<sup>th</sup>

Commenced With fresh breeze from  
N with snow squalls working to the N E all  
sail set 5 P M stowed light sails furled courses  
saw ice to the N E Middle part thick snow  
storm Latter part the same lying aback off the  
ice gaming with James Allen's ship Florida of  
New Bedford 4 ships in sight
