

Monday June 15<sup>th</sup>

Commenced fine light breeze from NW ship lying at anchor of Plover bay in scattering ice 2 PM took the Ancha and stood in to the bay 5 PM came to with part Ancha in 20 fathoms and veered away 30 fathoms East Head bearing ESE distant 4 miles Middle part Gaming with ship California latter part calm and foggy

Tuesday June 16<sup>th</sup>

Commenced calm and foggy ship lying at anchor in Plover bay 4 PM fresh breeze from W and clear 6 PM the ice came down on us took the Ancha and made sail and worked up under West Head Middle part calm 2 AM came to with part Ancha in 18 fathoms and veered away 40 fathoms West Head bearing N by N distant 5 miles Latter part light breeze from W two boats in shore

Wednesday June 17<sup>th</sup>

Commenced fine and light variable winds ship lying at anchor in Plover bay in scattering ice 4 PM the boats returned & the ships saw nothing Middle and latter part calm

Thursday June 18<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with light variable winds and foggy ship lying at anchor in Plover bay 4 PM clear sky and landed the ship George Howland of New Bedford 10 PM moderate breeze from NW took the Ancha and made sail to the Westward in company with ship George Howland 10 30 PM calm ship drifting to the SE Middle and latter part the same several ships in sight

Friday June 19<sup>th</sup>

Commenced calm and heavy ship drifting to ESE along the land in scattering ice 5 PM foggy came to in 10 fathoms with the Kedge Ancha Middle part ship lying at anchor latter part light breeze from NW and heavy 7 AM took the Ancha and set all sail steering to the SE along the land Gaming with Barque Eagle of N Bedford

Saturday June 20<sup>th</sup>

Commenced clear and calm 1 PM came to with the Kedge in 15 fathoms West Head of Marcus Bay bearing NE distant 8 miles Middle part foggy latter part moderate breeze from NE 5 AM took the Ancha set all sail steering N by N several ships in sight 12 M Plover bay bore N distant eight miles
