

Friday June 26<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with fresh breeze from N.E. with rain ship heading N.N.W. under topsails and courses 4 P.M. moderate set all sail 10 P.M. tacked ship to E.S.E. Middle part 2 A.M. tacked to N.N.W. latter part fresh breeze from N.E. with rain 10 A.M. took in topgallant sails and fly jib wore ship to E.S.E.

Saturday June 27<sup>th</sup>

Commenced blowing fresh from N.E. with rain ship heading E.S.E. under topsails 2 P.M. below reefed the topsails furled jib and mousain Middle and latter part the same 6 A.M. wore ship to N.N.E. 10 A.M. more moderate set all sail

Sunday June 28<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with moderate breeze from E. with rain ship heading N.N.E. all sail set Middle and latter part foggy fresh breeze from E.S.E. steering N.E. 10 P.M. took in topgallant sails and fly jib 6 A.M. set them again 10 A.M. Hozy steering N.N.E.

Monday June 29<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with fresh breeze from E steering N.N.E. all sail set 2 P.M. saw Cape Achen bearing N.E. distant 10 miles 4 P.M. spoke the brig *Marcella* of San Francisco Capt Readfield came on board 5 P.M. returned her up steering N.W. for Cape Bering 10 P.M. came to with headyards aback Cape bearing bearing S distant 4 miles the natives came on board Middle part Calm latter part light breeze from E steering to the Westward all sail set 10 A.M. spoke and James barque *Hellen* near took 30 sacks of Potatoes from her for ship *Florida* of San Francisco

Tuesday June 30<sup>th</sup>

Commenced Hozy light variable winds ship making to the Southward Cape Bering bearing S.E. distant 25 miles three ships in sight 6 P.M. Calm came on with the kedge in 12 fathoms Middle part the same latter part 6 A.M. light breeze from N.E. took the anchor and made sail steering S.E. 12 M. Cape Bering bore N.E. distant 4 miles three ships in sight
