Commenced with strong gales from the South West employed in taking on Board our recruits at 6 P.M. finished and kept off S.E. Middle part calm and rain latter part a fine breeze from the N.W. so ends

Thursday Oct 8th

Commenced with fine breezes from the westward and heavy weather at 1 P.M. kept off E. by P.M. at 5. hauled. S.W. at 6 P.M. saw the Isl of St. bearing S.E. Middle part lay up S.E. with a light breeze at 8 P.M. the Isl of Fayal and Pico bore S.W. dist 30. miles latter part strong gales at 8 P.M. double reefed the Top sails and hauled the Jib and Main sail

Friday Oct 9th

Commenced with strong gales laying off the Isl of Fayal under short sail at Middle and latter part fine weather at 3 A.M. kept off and ran into the Landen at Fayal and sent a Boat on shore and brought a new Boat and shipped an able seaman at 6 P.M. the Boat returned on Board. kept off

Sunday Oct 11th

Elle breezes and fair weather employed in various jobs

Middle part lay with the Union Top with the st. thickets just in sight bearing S.E. at day light fired a gun and kept S.E. with a light breeze from the N.W.

Monday Oct 12

South

Light airs and variable at 6 P.M. at thickets bear S.E. at 15 miles bore the Union Top sail to the mast heading west with the wind at South at 6 A.M. hauled full and heading up S.E. at 8 A.M. saw a great number of large sperm Whales at 9 hauled and struck one to the Starboard boat and killed him so ends of the Land bearing West Dist 20 miles
