Crossing of the Tropic in 1846
Thursday Dec 3rd 1846

Commenced with fair weather and a good breeze saw several finbacks and 2 right whales going quick to the North at 4 P.M. saw the ship of Tristan & John's Quinba leaving port at 7 P.M. shortened sail the ship bearing South by East 20 miles at midnight weared ship off shear at 6 P.M. made still and stood in and ran down a run the E part of the land at saw nothing at 10 P.M. strong gale from the North hauled off under short sail heading E by N ends

Friday Dec 4th

Commenced with strong gales from the N.W. lay up W.M. under double reef. Main top sail and other storm sails with thick & rainy weather. Middle and latter part the same Lat $^{\circ}$ by CEs 36.57

Saturday Dec 5th

Commenced with fresh breezes from the South and west lay up W.M. at 1 P.M. Tristan & John's Quinba bear S.W. 20 miles Middle & latter part the same strong breeze at 5 P.M. saw right whales leaved but could not get on at 10 came on board and stood in for the settlement to see if we could get a few Potatoes. It ends with moderate

Sunday Dec 6th X ~~Saturday~~ Dec 6th

Commenced with moderate weather at 1 P.M. sent a boat into the woods at 6 the return on board weared ship to shear heading N.E. by E with the wind at E.N.E. and light at that latter part fresh breezes from the South at 6 P.M. saw several right whales going quick to the North

Sunday Dec 7th

Commenced with fresh breezes at stood in for the settlement at 1 P.M. sent on shear one cask of 130 of Bread and barrels of Flour at 6 returned on board with 40 barrels of Potatoes weared ship and stood of shear under short sail latter part foggy weather at 10 P.M. saw right whale going quick to the North Lat $^{\circ}$ by CEs 37.40
