Wednesday Jan 13th

Commenced with brisk breezes from N.W. with very pleasant weather. Coars per Comp SE by E at 7 P.M. reefed ship N.E. Middle part the same. Latter part reefed ship. At Eastward at 11 A.M. saw a French ship of 1000 tons bound to the S. of Boston

Commenced with brisk breezes from the N. with pleasant weather. Coars per South and SE by E with all sail out. Middle & latter part the same

Commenced with Brisk Breezes from the North with fair weather. Coars per Comp South & SE by E. Middle & latter parts. Middle same. Unbent & repaired the fore sail with 70 yds of Brown Ticking

Commenced with Brisk Breezes from the North with fair weather. Coars per Comp. At 5 P.M. finished and bent the fore sail, Middle part reefed at 3 P.M. the wind hauled to the S.W. latter part strong gales under Double reefs

Commenced with strong gales from the N.W. under Double reefs. Coars per Comp SE. Middle part the same. Latter part more moderate made all sail strong. A.S.E.

Commenced with light breezes from the N.W. with pleasant weather at 4 P.M. Spoke the ship Brunswick of New Bedford Capt. Henry 800 tons. Middle part calm. Latter light airs from the North Coars steering to Southward

Tuesday Jan 19th

Commenced with light breezes from the North steering to the South per Comp. with Brunswick. Middle part fresh breezes. Latter part more moderate with rain

Wednesday Jan 20th

Commenced with Fresh Breezes from the N.W. with squally weather. Coars South per Comp. Middle part the same. Latter part fine weather

Commenced with light breezes from the North with pleasant weather. all sail out steering to the South. Coars per Comp. Middle & latter part strong gales from N.W. under double reefs

Friday Jan 22nd

Lost the Mast Boat

Commenced with strong gales from the westward with steering to the Eastward under double reefs at 5 P.M. took in the fore topsail at 7 shipped a heavy sea and lost the Mast Boat with all of her gear except the mainmast left to the wind and took in the fore sail. Middle part the same at 6 A.M. more moderate made sail and reefed off E.S.E. latter the same with thick weather
