Friday Feb 26th Variation 35.00
Commenced with thick and rainy weather with a moderate breeze from North Middle. Sails part fresh - breeze from the N.W. under double reef
Lat^o 44.33 Longt 49.38

Saturday Feb 27th
Commenced with strong gales from N.W. at 4 P.M. took in the fore & Mizzen Top^{mid} & fore sail and close reef the main headed to the S.E. Middle & latter the same at 1 P.M. head ship to N.W.
Lat^o 44.27 Longt 49.57

Sunday Feb 28th
Commenced with strong gales from N.W. under close reef main Top sail headed to S.W. Middle & latter parts the same with a very heavy sea to ends

very bad weather

Monday Mar 1st 1847
Commenced with strong gales from the North headed to the westward under close reef main Top sail. Middle part the same latter part more moderate with the wind the westward, at 8 P.M. saw a ship to the North and set the fore sail
Lat^o 45.16 Longt 50.37

Tuesday Mar
Commenced with a strong gale from N.W. headed to the North and westward under close reef main Top sail & fore sail. Middle part the same latter part light breeze & calms
Lat^o 44.37 Longt 47.55

Tuesday Mar 3rd Wednesday Variation 35.00
Commenced with light air from the South headed to the Westward Middle part the same latter part kept off south at 11 A.M. saw the Leander Boat fast to a whale so ends
Lat 45.17 Longt

Thursday Mar 4th
Commenced with fresh breeze from the N.W. at 4 P.M. saw a right whale boarded and struck him to the W.B. at 5 got him to the ship's Middle part fresh gale from the north with heavy squalls of rain heeled on to cut the whale getting the head & lips and the peace tear of and the weather being so bad that we had to quit cutting so ends

Wednesday Mar Friday Mar 5th
Commenced with strong gales from the westward with rugged sea that we could not cut Middle part the same. Latter part more moderate heeled on and cut the whale in set the main Top sail double reef and fore sail and commenced voyaging, at 11 P.M. spoke the Vermont of Mystic Capt Bayly 7th then cut 7th of the ends
Lat^o 45.38

Saturday Mar 6th
Commenced with strong gales Middle & latter the same with a thick fog from the N.W. headed to N.E. at 10 A.M. veered ship to the N.W. employed in voyaging
Lat^o 44.57 Longt 49.49

Sunday Mar 7th
Commenced with fresh breeze from the N.W. with a thick fog headed to the S.W. at 9 P.M. spoke the Bark Albatross of J. Green Party 17th then cut 11th of the Middle part thick at 2 P.M. boarded ship to the S.E. at daylight itighted up, seeing whales leaved the ship stuck on to the S.W. at 7 P.M. took the ship and cut him in to ends with very thick weather employed in voyaging
