Monday Mar 8th Variation 35^o 00
 Commenced with moderate & very thick weather
 winds from the North & headed to the North & Eastward
 and Southward westward employed in hauling & stowing
 down the ends

Tuesday Mar 9th
 Commenced with thick and moderate middle
 and part rainy latter part very pleasant with the winds
 from S.W. to West S.W. employed in stowing down
 at 11 o'clock finished hauling

Wednesday Mar 10th

Commenced with fine and clear weather
 middle part headed to the North with a very light
 breeze from the westward latter part calm employed
 in bracing out the Fore Mast for new shrouds

Thursday Mar 11th

Commenced with slight breezes from the North
 heading to the S.W. middle & latter a fresh from
 the North with a thick fog latter part employed
 in cleaning Beans so ends this day

Friday Mar 12th

Commenced with Fresh Breezes from the North
 with fair weather steering to the S.W. & West
 middle & latter under short sail with a thick fog
 so ends this day

Saturday Mar 13th

Commenced with a light breeze from the
 North with a fine fog middle & latter the same
 headed to S.W. & S.E. so ends this day with thick fog

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Sunday Mar 14th Variation 35^o 00

Commenced with light breezes from the N.E.
 heading to the South and westward under short sail at
 4 P.M. veered ship to the South and Eastward at 5 P.M.
 the fog lifted up for a few moments we saw Seal
 Isl bearing S.W. per compass a boat 20 miles dist.
 at 6 veered ship to S.W. set the jib a spanker
 middle part heavy squalls of rain with thunder &
 lightning at midnight had the winds very bustling from
 North to West at 2 o'clock headed to the N.E. veered ship
 heading to the N.W. at 3 it shifted suddenly to
 the S.W. and blew up a strong and steady breeze
 set the fore sail fore spanker jib and spanker sails

Monday Mar 15th

Commenced with strong gales from the N.W.
 ship under short sail heading S.W. middle part
 heading S.W. at 6 o'clock veered ship to the North
 and set whole top sails so ends this day several
 birds in sight

Tuesday Mar 16th

Commenced with fresh breezes from the
 westward heading to the North middle & latter part
 S.W. latter with all sail out as they were remarkable
 Decidedly as the saying is

Wednesday Mar 17th

Commenced with brisk breezes from N.W.
 veers S.E. with all sail out at 6 o'clock veered ship to the
 South and double set the top sails middle part the
 same latter part under all sail with light airs from
 the Westward veers S.W. so ends

Thursday Mar 18th

Commenced with light airs from the Westward
 veers South middle & latter part light breezes from the
 North veers S.W. to slight this day No Obs Cloudy
