

Continued Remarks on Board Ship St Peter

Monday Mar 27th 1847 Variation 33.0

Commenced with light breeze and calm, a large
 gain of whales in sight leeward and struck one to the
 L.P. and the Iron den. Spindle and Latter parts strong
 Breeze from the North at 11 A.M. kept off too
 ran down under the lee of Pinguin Is.
 at 10 the 2^d bearing East West 4 miles

Tuesday Apr 30th
 Commenced with strong gales from the N
 ran under the lee of the Is. and to go off
 sent two Boats in to see if they were any
 whales saw two very small ones to small to strike
 at 4 P.M. came on Board and hauld off to the Eastward
 under short sail Middle part Moderate with thick weather
 Latter part strong gales from the North backing and filling about
 the land and stowing down so ends this day

Wednesday Mar 31st

Commenced with fresh gales from the West
 laying upon the Northward tack under short
 sail Middle part light and Moderate weather Latter
 part fresh gales from the North bearing E. S. E.
 so ends employed in stowing in the forepart

Thursday Apr 1st 1847

Commenced with strong gales from N.W.
 heading S. E. Middle part Moderate Latter part
 strong gales under short sail employ in sawing
 so ends this day on the
 weather headed to the Westward

Friday Apr 2nd

Commenced with strong gales at 2 P.M. took
 in the fore sail and Main top sail heading west
 with the 1st wind at North Middle part
 the same later more moderate put the top sails double
 reef at 10 A.M. the hauld gradually to the point
 and commenced sailing fresh breeze N.W. so ends
 in bearing N.W. by S Dist 40 miles

Saturday Apr 3rd

Commenced with fresh gales from the North
 South steering for Pinguin Is. at 4 P.M. took in the
 fore & Main top sail Middle part the same
 at daylight stood a crest to Big Is. so rugged could do
 nothing gave it up and kept off to the N.W. by S under
 while top sails Big Is. bearing east dist 5 miles so ends

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Sunday Apr 4th Variation 35.00

Commenced with strong gales from the south
 Coars S.E. at 6 P.M. took in the main top sail & fore sail
 and huffed to the wind heading E at 6 O.M. kept off
 N.E. by W so ends this
 Lat of the 43.45 Long by Gun 47.36

Monday Apr 5th

Commenced with strong breeze from the N.W.
 Coars N.E. with all sail set Middle part hauled up
 at 8 & S.E. with a strong breeze at midnight huffed the
 1st Latter part more Moderate but another 1st and made all
 sail wind from the foreward pleasant weather
 so ends this day
 Lat of the 44.15 Long by Gun
 47.44 47.13

Tuesday Apr 6th

Commenced with a light breeze from the
 foreward steering S.E. with all sail set Middle & Latter
 part the same at 8 O.M. took a Lunar Obs made
 the Long 48.57.30 Lat of the 39.25 Long by Gun 48.18

Wednesday Apr 7th

Commenced with a light breeze from N.E.
 heading E.S.E. with all sail set Middle part very
 strong gales with heavy squalls from the N.W.
 took in all sail at 6 O.M. more moderate with
 a strong and steady breeze from N.W. Coars N.W.E.
 Lat of the 39.49
 Long 48.55

Thursday Apr 8th

Commenced with fresh breezes from the
 N.W. Coars S.E. by S Middle & Latter were equally
 under double reef top sails so ends this day
 Lat of the 36.24
 Long by Gun 49.41

Friday Apr 9th

Commenced with fresh breezes and squalls
 weather from the N.W. Coars N.E. and N.W.E.
 Middle part met the same Latter part fine weather
 made all sail wind at West Coars N.W.E.
 so ends this day
 Lat of the 33.56
