Commenced with fresh breezes from the south at 6 P.M. hauled the fore and Mizzen Top sails and main sail laying up & E. Middle part the same latter part under double reefs heading west at 3 P.M. made Comore Is bearing E by S 15° Lat 12° 11' 34" Longt 41° 46'

Friday ~~Wednesday~~ May 28th

Commenced with fresh breezes from the south heading West & W by S under double reef Top sails at 6 P.M. Tacked and lay up S.E. Middle part the same latter part more moderate made all sail at 11 A.M. Tacked and lay up west at Variation of the Island of Comore bearing E by S 40 miles Dist

Saturday ~~Friday~~ May 29th

Commenced with fresh breezes from S.E. under double reef Top sails heading West at 6 P.M. hauled ship and lay up N.E. at 7 Took in the fore and Mizzen Top sails Middle & latter part the same Lat 12° 11' 34" Longt 42° 20'

Sunday May 30th

Commenced with strong breezes from S.E. under double reef Fore & Main Top sails heading N.E. Middle part the same latter part more moderate made all sail at 11 A.M. Tacked heading N.W. at 1 P.M. the town on Comore bearing N.E. dist 10 miles & ends this day

Monday May 31st

Commenced with fresh breezes all sail set heading N.W. at 6 P.M. Double reef the Top sails and set quarter watches headed by the flowers Middle part the same at 7 P.M. reefed of N.W. under double reef Top sails the breeze at South to ends Lat 11° 13'

Tuesday May

ends this month with Damnable words as I ever heard of Officers standing quarter watches in the lat of 11 south. When up in the lat of 11 south it was not needed that those officers should stand in the quarter watches five with whole Top sails out some times and I think that if as much seaward as these courses you are

Tuesday Commenced with Fresh breezes from the South lower W by E. under double reef Top sails at 4 P.M. under and shifted the Top sails Middle part squally lower N.W. by E. Latter part light breezes under whole Top sails Lat 9° 15' Longt 41° 46'

Wednesday June 2nd

Commenced with light breezes from the south lower S.W. by E. under whole Top sails at 6 P.M. double reef the Top sails Middle part the same latter part light breezes & very pleasant weather. Finished the Capt Stave name Lat 9° 15' Longt 41° 49'

Thursday June 3rd

Commenced with fine weather Breeze N.W. by E with all sail set to light breeze at 6 P.M. double reef the Top sails Middle part the same at 5 P.M. hauled all sail stood to the S.W. latter part the same This day I turned the spooner off duty it being the second time that he has been off duty this voyage the reason is this when expostulated with for neglect of duty he was very impudent & told him a many other things that he had been often he to quarrel before the ships company when ordered to do what was not agreeable to him he answered that he had com so and should do so a gain Bender saying he would not do ships work him self although he had not him order personally to do it in fact he had done all he could John Mon boats Steer
