Commenced with fresh breezes from N.W. heading N.E. Se. degree distance 2 miles of St. Middle & latter part much the same so end this day Cruising ^{9.33 South} Long by Ch 55.46 East

Sunday Marth 5
Commenced with fresh breezes from N.W. off the land in sit St. Middle & latter part much the same the land in sit so end this day Cruising

Monday Marth 6
Commenced with fresh breezes from N.W. off the land in sit St. Middle & latter part much the same so end this day Cruising the land in sit

Tuesday Marth 7
Commenced with fresh breezes from N.W. off the land in sit St. Middle & latter part much the same so end this day Cruising to the Com. Island in sit

Wednesday Marth 8

Commenced with strong breezes from N.W. at 12 M. double reef the Tops at 6 P. M. hold back the main yard at half past 12 M. the watch on deck were alarmed by a scream in the Forecastle two of the watch immediately hastened below to learn the cause the lights were all blown out but they heard a struggle in Sumner Forest Deck and when they got to his assistance they found a black man by the name of Jeno in the Berth and on top of the said Forest with his hand over his mouth and cowering and shaking with his right hand which he aimed with a knife with all his strength, and when the villain was pulled from the top of Forest he sprang at them Mohamed trying to secure him and knives in hand but one of them caught up a bucket and knocked him down the Capt and Officers were immediately aroused and hastened forward as soon as possible and there they found the poor fellow but and murdered.

in the most possible manner there were ten wonder in all some of them are slight four or five of them very dangerous one in the side a boat six inches long and nearly through into the abdomen and across the small of the back about the same length into the bone another very deep and large one a little below the hip joint he has immediately taken into the cabin his powder dressed and every bag of sail set for Baslin from which place he has then distant a boat 70 miles arrived there and anchored at 2 P. M. of the same day sent a boat for the Governor and doctor stationed on the Island of Surinam which dressed his wounds and pronounced them very dangerous he has then taken on shore to the Gov. house both two of his ship mates to take care of him I can give no solution of this truly most horrible and savage crime unless as he the criminal himself said that he meant to kill one or two and then jump over board he had provided him self with 2 large rapine long cut knives and a spear that belonged to one of the crew which he planned to use as a weapon the criminal has secured in little Jeno and chained in the Fore Hold so end this day off sail set steering for Baslin hold up the laid chain and bent it at 2 P. M. came to anchor

Thursday Marchth 9

Commenced with light breezes from North latter part much the same the middle part much the same the sick man much the same so end this day to anchor in 14 fathoms of water

Commenced with fresh breezes from N.E. off the land in sit St. Middle & latter part much the same so end this day to anchor

Saturday Marchth 11

Commenced with light breezes from N.E. at 1 P. M. laid anchor and sent to see the left Ensign hoisted on shore to take care of Sumner Forest Ship met the waters on way of 1/2 a month St. Middle & latter part much the same Com. Island in sit so end this day Cruising

Sunday Marchth 12

Commenced with light breezes from N.E. at 5 P. M. sent a boat to see a shore on Com. Island to catch Turtle St. Middle & latter part much the same the boat came up with 1 Turtle Saw & Bayne of the lee beam so end this day
