Saturday 8th.

Begins pleasant with a light Easterly breeze.
Latter part wind variable. put in starboard boat
on the ground. saw 1 sail standing Eastward.

Sunday 9th.

Begins & Ends pleasant with a moderate S.W. breeze.

Lat. by Obs. $36^{\circ}15' N$. Long. by Chr. $44^{\circ}42' W$.

Thursday 13th.

Begins & Ends with a light N.W. breeze under all sail &c.

Lowered 3 boats for the purpose of pulling up B. Pitt
& Boat killed on.
