Begins & Ends with a fresh Easterly breeze. Under short sail at 5 o'clock P.M. raised a large whale & crewed boat but all in vain 5 o'clock A.M. raised another lowered boat but in vain 7 o'clock returned to the ship & commenced boiling.

Lat. by Obs. 35° 26' N. Long. by Chr. 46° 10' W.

Friday 4th.

Begins & Ends with a light Easterly breeze. Under short sail 3 1/2 o'clock P.M. raised a large whale & crewed boat but in vain 10 o'clock A.M. finished boiling. Saw 1 whale to the windward.

Lat. by Obs. 35° 33' N. Long. by Chr. 46° 17' W.

Saturday 5th.

Begins & Ends with a westerly breeze. Hand employed in stowing oil.

Lat. by Obs. 35° 58' N. Long. by Chr. 46° 24' W.

Sunday 6th.

Begins & Ends with a strong westerly breeze under short sail at 2 o'clock P.M. finished stowing oil. Latter part squally & rainy. no men aloft.

Monday Aug. 7th 1843.

Begins & Ends with a strong N.E. breeze under short sail.

Lat. Obs. 35° 50' N. Long. by Chr. 46° 06' W.

Tuesday 8th.

Begins & Ends with a fresh Easterly breeze. Spoke Baque Sarah Mattapoiset 18 mod. out 550 lbs.

Lat. by Obs. 35° 38' N. Long. by Chr. 45° 33' W.

Wednesday 9th.

Begins & Ends with a fresh Easterly breeze at 4 1/2 o'clock P.M. saw several large whales lobbed at 8 o'clock got one at 8 o'clock had him alongside at 4 P.M. commenced cutting.

Lat. by Obs. 35° 31' N. Long. by Chr. 45° 01' W. 75° 31' W.

Thursday 10th.

Begins & Ends pleasant with a light Easterly breeze. at 2 o'clock P.M. finished cutting in whale at 3 o'clock commenced boiling. Saw one sail.

Lat. by Obs. 35° 52' N. Long. by Chr. 45° 58' W.

Friday 11th.

Begins & Ends pleasant with a light baffling breeze. Crew employed in extracting oil from blubber &c.

Lat. by Obs. 35° 40' N. Long. by Chr. 46° 13' W.
