

Thursday Aug. 31st 1843.

Begins & Ends with a gale from the Westward. & sailing
boiling between the reefs.

Lat. by Obs. 36° 03' N. Long. by Chr. 35° 07' W.

Friday Sept. 1st

Begins with a gale & squalls at 1 o'clock P.M. Commenced
taking in the heads at 4 o'clock boiled the lard & long
meat & boiling heads Mr. Spence's pleasant heading.
S. part strong breeze & some rain at 9 o'clock P.M.
finished boiling heads.

Lat. by Obs. 35° 56' N. Long. by Chr. 37° 39' W.

Saturday 2nd

Begins with a strong breeze from the Westward & smoky
under short sail at 8 A.M. finished boiling & cooled down
steering E. by N. at 6 P.M. hove to heading to the Westward
during a heavy gale from the Southward. under close
sail. Mr. S. sail. Mr. Spencer & S. sail. at 9 1/2 o'clock finished
Mr. S. sail.

Lat. by Obs. 36° 54' N.

Sunday 3rd

Begins with a S.W. gale heading Westward. under
Mr. Spencer & Stay sail at 6 P.M. began to make
Mr. & S. part fresh breeze from the Westward adding on sail
occasionally.

Lat. by Obs. 37° 34' N. Long. by Chr. 36° 50' W.

Monday Sept. 4th 1843.

Begins with a strong N.W. breeze steering E. by N. under
full sail at 1 o'clock. Shortened sail steering E. Mr. Spence
light breeze. S. part nearly calm at 6 o'clock P.M. luffed
to & commenced stowing oil.

Lat. by Obs. 35° 14' N.

Tuesday 5th

Begins & Ends calm. Mr. Spence employed in stowing oil.
Saw Frigate.

Lat. by Obs. 35° 55' N. Long. by Chr. 35° 55' W.

Wednesday 6th

Begins calm. Mr. Spence employed in stowing oil & c.
at 1 o'clock P.M. finished & washed off deck & c.
Mr. Spence's S. part light breeze steering East
under all sail. Mr. Spence picked up a vessel's lower
mast measured 20 inches through. Saved part of it.

Lat. by Obs. 35° 19' N. Long. by Chr. 35° 22' W.

Thursday 7th

Begins & Ends pleasant with a light W. breeze.
steering E. by N. under Mr. S. sail & Mr. Spence's.

Lat. by Obs. 35° 51' N. Long. by Chr. 34° 02' W.
