N. by E. at 12 o'clock P. M. took in Bussing Sail & S. by E. sail
at 3 o'clock P. M. took in main S. sail & saw the N. E. of sail
bearing N. by E. 15 miles distant by estimation.
I part Cruising off the North End of St. John's

Monday 9th.

Begins pleasant with a moderate breeze. Cruising on at 6 o'clock P.M. dropped Maud Hook near S.W. point of Isle of Sol. at 7 o'clock P.M. Capt. & Boats Crew went ashore to the tower.

August 10th

Wiggin's went out with a light breeze 1 o'clock, P.M. Capt. Carver on board with 7 Shells & a doz. pairs of Colours. at 3 o'clock we stood under way & about 4 o'clock all sail stirring & by 5 o'clock at 5 o'clock stirring up. at 12 o'clock stirring up. Light breeze & light breeze stirring & under full sail.

Wednesday 11th.

"Regiment" & "Endeavour" again a light S.W. breeze. Steering
