Begins & Ends pleasant with a fine southerly breeze. at 2 P.M. Spike 15. Dr. Franklin, Francis, & others. Spent out 200 lbs of oil. at 7 P.M. Capt. went aboard of her & purchased 5 Bbls of salt pork &c.

Saturday 10th.

Begins & Ends pleasant with a fine & easterly breeze under all sail.

Sunday 11th.

Begins & Ends pleasant with a fresh & westerly breeze under all sail. Saw 1 ship.

Lat. by Obs. $35^{\circ}45'$ N. Long. by Obs. $46^{\circ}25'$ W.

Monday 12th.

Begins & Ends pleasant with a light & westerly breeze under all sail at 1 P.M. Saw 5 or 6 large sperm whales leaved foat but did not get fast. Whales started to the windward.
