

Friday Sept. 6th 1844.

Begins & ends pleasant with a fine Westley breeze
at 7 AM. began stowing oil &c.

Lat. by Rs. 35° 48' N. Long. by Chr. 47° 10' W.

Saturday 7th

Begins pleasant with a fine Westley breeze
crew employed in stowing oil at 3 P.M. finished
storing & washed decks. M. part light breeze & some
rain. P.M. part light N. Westley breeze under all sail

Lat. by Rs. 35° 38' N. Long. by Chr. 47° 17' W.

Sunday 8th

Begins with a light Eastley breeze at 12 P.M. spoke
a Dutch Sloop from Jamaica bound to Amsterdam
M. & L. part light & nearly calm under all sail
& some rain.

Lat. by Rs. 35° 34' N. Long. by Chr. 47° 23' W.

Monday 9th

Begins & ends cloudy with a fine N. Eastley breeze
under all sail. Crew employed in ratting
& M. & L. part light rigging

Lat. by Rs. 35° 10' N. Long. by Chr. 47° 05' W.

Tuesday Sept. 10th 1844.

Begins with a fresh Westley breeze under short sail.
M. & L. part strong Westley breeze with squalls of rain
lying to under short M. & L. part & close M. & L. sail &c.

Lat. by Rs. 35° 54' N. Long. by Chr. 47° 25' W.

Wednesday 11th

Begins & ends with a strong gale from the N.E. &
squalls of rain lying to under close M. & L. sail & flag
sail. Saw a whaling boat steering Eastward.

Lat. by Rs. 35° 40' N. Long. by Chr. 47° 19' W.

Thursday 12th

Begins with a moderate breeze from the Westward
M. part light breeze. L. part light Westley breeze &
pleasant. Steaming East under all sail. Crew employed
in ratting & raising rigging.

Lat. by Rs. 35° 20' N. Long. by Chr. 47° 43' W.

Friday 13th

Begins pleasant with a moderate Westley breeze. Steering
E. under all sail. M. part fresh Northley breeze & squalls
steering E. by N. under double M. & L. sail. L. part fresh
breeze & squalls at 8 A.M. saw a school of sperm whales
at 1/2 lowered boats at 10 M. Boat fastened then L. boat
& then I. boat & was filled with water. L. & I. boat cut from
the whales & went aboard.
