

Remarks on board Ship Sally Anne May 17th 1835

Commenced with moderate breezes at 4 P.M. and fine weather at 1 P.M. Saw blackfish Lownd and took one middle part. Latter part fine weather Ship heading South. Lighted many porpoises and a number of sail this end.

Lat. by Obs. 37.00 N
Long by Est. 73.09 W.

Remarks on board Monday May 18th 1835

First part light breezes from S.W. and fine weather Ship heading South at 4 P.M. tacked and headed W.N.W. at sunset took sail heading the same middle part fine weather Latter part moderate breezes at 4 P.M. Ship heading S. this concludes

Lat. in 36.31 N
Long in 73.45 West.

Remarks on Tuesday May 19th 1835

Commenced with light breezes at 4 P.M. Ship heading N. West at sunset Shortened sail Latter part fresh breezes from the S.W. Ship heading S.E. at 10 saw blackfish Lownd got 2. This concludes

3 men unwell Lat. in 36.18
Long in 73.55

Remarks on Wednesday May 20th 1835

First part fresh breezes at 1 P.M. Ship heading W.N.W. at 4 P.M. saw blackfish Lownd took 2 at sunset Shortened sail at daylight made sail off Latter part fine weather weather saw several sail but no whales This ends

Lat. 36.21 N
Long 73.45 West

Remarks on Thursday May 21st 1835

Commenced with fine weather wind S.W. at 5 P.M. spoke Brig William of Jamaica from St. Johns N. Brunswick at 7 Schooner Lonsell of Rochester. Mugh 6 weeks out 75 barrels oil Latter part fine weather Lighted a number of sail 3 men of duty Lat. in 36.31 N
Long in 73.52 W.

Remarks on Friday May 22nd 1835

First part fine weather at 4 P.M. spoke Brig Granitt from Mobile for Providence Latter part foggy wind light and baffling this ends

Lat. by acct. 36.48
Long in 74.15

Remarks on Saturday May 23rd 1835

Commenced with fresh breezes at N.E. at 8 P.M. furled the foresail and closed reef Mainmast Middle part. Hoisting Gales Latter part the same Lighted several sail this ends

Lat. by Obs. 35.58
Long by Count. 74.19

Remarks on Sunday May 24th 1835

First part fresh breezes at N.E. middle part the same Latter part more moderate Lighted several sails but no whales this ends 4 men unwell Lat. in 35.48 Long in 74.40

Remarks on Monday May 25th 1835

First moderate breezes at N.E. at 4 P.M. spoken by a Spanish Schooner after sailing showed from seventy to 100 men appeared to be Molatoes chiefly suited in English Latter part wind W.N.W. this ends Several sail in sight

Lat. in 36.08 Long 73.40 West
