first part light breeze at S.W. Ship
heading S.E. & E. middle part fine weather
latter part the same Saw Blackfish
Lowered took nothing thus Concludes

Remarks on Monday June 15th 1835
first part fine weather Saw Blackfish
Lowered took ~~top~~ latter part fine and pleasant
weather Saw Blackfish lowered to 4 thus
Ended Spoke a Ship from Boston did not
learn where bound

Remarks on Tuesday June 16th 1835
first part fine weather sighted several
tail middle part fine and pleasant
latter ditto. at 7:30 A.M. sighted whales
Lowered at 11 took one to the ship the
other boats chasing thus Concludes

Lat. in 42° 40'

Long. in 47° 00' W

Remarks on Wednesday 17th 1835

Commenced with fine weather at 12:30

P.M. came on board did not get fast
at 1:30 commenced cutting at 5 p.m.
Spoke a M. Brig from Quebec for Bon
Aparies latter part sighted nothing
looked like whales. Saw a whale ship
to windward thus Concludes employed
in sailing

Remarks on Thursday June 18th 1835
first part fresh breeze at S.E. Spoke ship
Gen Pike She had taken 8 Blackfish
middle and latter part fresh breeze at
S.E. sighted no whales thus Concludes

Long. by clock 45° 00' W

by obs. 45° 58' W

Remarks on Friday June 19th 1835
Commenced with strong breeze at
S.E. Ship heading S.W. middle and
latter part the same. sighted no whales
thus Concludes G.P. in sight.

Lat. in 41° 25'

Long. in 46° 50' W

Remarks on Saturday June 20th 1835
Commenced with fresh breeze at the
S.E. Ship heading S.W. latter part
employed in stowing down oil thus
Concludes Ship heading S.E. with
sail.

Lat. in 41° 21'

Long. in 47° 12' W

Remarks on Sunday June 21st 1835
Commenced with fresh breeze at South Ship
heading S.E. middle and latter part more
moderate latter do. sighted G.P. and one other
tail thus Concludes Lat. in 41° 37' N
Long. in 45° 30' W.

Remarks on Monday June 22nd 1835
Commenced with light breeze at S. by E.
Ship heading E by S. by the wind latter part
fine weather sighted nothing thus Ended

Lat. in 42° 08'

Long. in 43° 30' W

Remarks on Tuesday June 23rd 1835
Commenced with fresh breeze at S.E. Ship
heading East sighted several tail latter part
sighted a whale to leeward run for her but
sighted nothing more of her thus Ended

Lat. in 42° 00'

Long. in 40° 50' W

Remarks on Wednesday June 24th 1835
Commenced with fresh breeze at South Ship
heading S.E. Spoke ship Gold Hunter of N. Haven
with 2 blackfish latter part spoke B. Ship Brown
West with 40 barrels thus Ended Saw no whales

Lat. in 42° 26' Long. in 39° 45' W
