

Transactions on Tuesday July 7th 1835
These 24 hours Calm Sighted no whales
the Cisero and Brunette in sight this
Concludes Tercera bearing West Dist 12 miles

Transactions on Wednesday July 8th 1835
these 24 hours Calm Sighted no whales 2 Ships
in sight this Ends Tercera bearing West
Dist 12 miles

Remarks on Thursday July 9th 1835
first part Calm later part light breezes
at 10, Ship heading to the westward
Brunette and Cisero in sight and the
~~Barge~~ ~~the~~ ~~the~~ Tercera bearing S.W.
Spoke Barge Clarence Dist. 6 miles
of New Bedford with 80 barrels.

Remarks on Friday July 10th 1835
Light breezes and calm heading up for
Graciosa at 8 Sighted a whale of Graciosa
and lowered at noon in chase this
Ends Graciosa bearing W.S.W. Dist 8 miles

Remarks on Saturday July 11th 1835
Commences with light air and calm
at 4 P.M. returned on board without the
whale continued the chase till the boat
was 12 miles from the ship latter part
fine weather Sighted nothing but 2 Ships
this Ends Graciosa bearing S.E. Dist.
10 miles

Remarks on Sunday July 12th 1835
these 24 hours fine weather Spoke Ship
Cisero had taken no oil later part light
a Barge Ship this Concludes

Graciosa bearing South Dist 12 miles

Transactions on Monday July 13th 1835
Commences with fine weather Sighted nothing
but Ships later part light breezes at west
at 11 P.M. Sighted a whale 4 1/2 miles to
windward this Ends Graciosa bearing N.W.
Dist. 8 miles

Remarks on Tuesday July 14th 1835
Commences with fine weather lowered
and pulled up for the whale but did
not sight her after lowering returned
on board at 4 past 8 at 7 Spoke Ship
Francis Henryetty of New Bedford with
120 barrels latter part strong breeze
at W.S.W. this Ends Graciosa bearing
S.W. Dist 5 miles

Remarks on Wednesday July 15th 1835
first part fresh breezes at the W.S.W.
latter part fine weather Sighted 2 Ships
but no whales this Ends Graciosa bearing
South Dist 8 miles

Remarks on Thursday July 16th 1835
these 24 hours light breezes at the west
Tercera bearing South Dist 10 miles

Remarks on Friday July 17th 1835
these 24 hours fine weather Spoke Ship
General Pike had taken no whales
Tercera bearing S.W. Dist 15 miles

Remarks on Saturday July 18th 1835
these 24 hours fine weather at 5 P.M.
Sighted a whale lowered at sunset
got fast at 12 night took the whale
to the ship later part employed in
cutting Spoke Ship A Casta of Sag Harbor
had taken no oil ~~the~~ Sighted
several sail this Ends Tercera bearing
S.W. Dist 15 miles
