Commences with fine weather Saw a Ship

latter part Strong Gale at N.E. thus
ends Employed in coiling Graciosa bearing
West Dist 12 miles

Transactions on Tuesday July 21st
Strong Gale at N.E. Lighted several
Sail but no whales employed in coiling
thus ends Graciosa bearing S.E. Dist 10 miles

Remarks on Wednesday July 22nd 1835-
Strong Gale at the N.E. latter part more
moderate Employed in stowing down oil.
thus ends Graciosa bearing North Dist
3 miles wind North

Remarks on Thursday July 23rd 1835-
first part sent the boat on shore
for refreshments middle and latter part
Strong Gale at N.E. thus ends
Graciosa bearing S.W. Dist 10 miles

Remarks on Friday July 24th 1835-
Commences with Strong Gale at N.W.
latter part moderate Spoke Barque Ship
Clarice of New Bedford with 800 barrels
thus ends Graciosa bearing South Dist 8 miles

Remarks on Saturday July 25th 1835-
These 24 hours light airs at N.E. Spoke
Ship Parker of N. Bedford no oil also
an English Ship 15 months out 750 barrels
thus ends Graciosa bearing S.W. Dist 8 miles

Remarks on Sunday July 26th 1835-
these 24 hours fine weather Lighted 2 Sail
but no whales thus ends Graciosa bearing N.
Dist 4 miles

Remarks on Monday July 27th 1835-
these 24 hours fine weather at 9 P.M.
Spoke Ship Ciseco had been at Fayall and
75 barrels Spine oil Sh. George bearing
S.E. Dist 10 miles

Transactions on Tuesday July 28th 1835-
These 24 hours fine and moderate weather
at 8 P.M. went on shore at the port of
Fayall at 7 returned on board latter part
employed in landing oil and taking
on board recruits the Barque Vermont
lying in port thus ends.

on Wednesday July 29th 1835-
these 24 hours fine weather at 7 P.M.
Discharged the oil and took all on board
at mission Fayall bearing S.E. Dist
one Barque in sight 12 miles

Remarks on Thursday July 30th 1835-
first part calm latter part moderate
Gale at E.N.E. Lighted no whales Saw
2 Barques and one Brig supposed them
to be whalers thus concludes S.E. Dist 15.

Remarks on Friday July 31st 1835-
these 24 hours fine weather Spoke Barque
Brunett had to be at 7 P.M. Lighted whale
lowered at 10 took one along side lowered
again but did not get fast thus ends
Brunett a whaling
Graciosa bearing S.E. Dist 8 miles
