in cutting Sighted at 2 P.M. and lowered
did not fasten saw Bruner take a wharf
Latter part fine weather saw no whales
Barnett cutting and the Br. Clarice in sight
thus Ends Employed in hauling

Remarks on Sunday Augst 2nd 1835
these 24 hours light breezes and fair weather
Employed in hauling 2 Barques and one
Brig in sight thus Ends Graciosa bearing
South Dist. 18 miles

Remarks on Monday Augst 3rd 1835
these 24 hours fine weather at 3 P.M.
finished hauling at 8 A.M. saw Blackfish
lowered took nothing at 10 spoke Ship
Parker had no oil thus Ends Terceira
bearing S.E. Dist 12 miles

Transactions on Tuesday Augst 4th
first part Squally cruising of S.E. &
Terceira latter part Plowed down oil
thus Ends

Transactions on Wednesday Augst 5th
these 24 hours fresh breezes at N.E.
latter part Employed in setting up. Hook
thus Concludes this Day Graciosa
bearing S.E. Dist 12 miles

Transactions on Thursday August 6th 1835
first part fresh breezes at N.E.
Cruising of Graciosa at 11 A.M. spoke
a Swedish Brig pain John Burgh for
N. York thus Ends
Graciosa bearing
South 12 miles Dist

Remarks on Friday August 7th 1835
these 24 hours fine weather at 3 P.M.
spoke Ship Lucas of New Bedford no oil
all well latter part fine weather no
fish Graciosa bearing S.E. Dist 12 miles

Transactions on Saturday August 8th
these 24 hours fine weather Sighted no
whales sighted Blackfish and took one
Graciosa bearing S.W. Dist 8 miles thus
Ends Lucas in sight took 2 Blackfish

Transactions on Sunday Augst 9th
first part fine weather latter part the
same Terceira bearing S.E. Dist 7 miles
Lucas and a Brig in sight thus Ends

Transactions on Monday August 10th
first part light breezes and calm spoke
Brig Gold Hunter of Edgartown no oil
latter part fresh breezes St. Michaels
bearing South Dist 7 miles thus Ends
Lucas in sight and one Ship one Barque
and Brig go Hunter thus

Transactions on Tuesday August 11th
these 24 hours fine weather spoke Ship
Pacific of New Bedford no oil at 5
Lucas and G. Hunter latter part fine
weather steering South thus Ends
Lat. in 37.40 N.
Long in 24.50 W.

Remarks on Wednesday August 12th 1835
these 24 hours fine weather Ship heading
S.E. Sighted no whales thus Ends Lucas
in sight
Lat. in 34.16
Long in 23.20
