

Friday Oct. 2 1835

These 24 hours fresh breezes
at S.E. by E. and veered ship
heading S.E. by S. sighted finback
Lucas in sight Lat. in 28.42
Long in 29.50

Saturday Oct. 3 1835

These 24 hours
fresh breezes at E.S.E. ship heading
S.E. by W. sighted finbacks and
some porpoises &c. the watch employed
in various jobs Lucas in sight.
Lat in 30.48
Long in 30.30

Sunday Oct. 4th 1835

These 24 hours fresh
breezes at the E.N.E. and fair
weather ship heading S.E. by S.
sighted many finbacks thus ends
Lucas in company Lat. in 32.18
Long in 30.40

Monday Oct. 5 1835

Strong gales from
N.E. by E. ship heading S.W. in company
with Lucas at 11 A.M. sighted a right
whale going quick to the S.E. thus
ends Lat. by acct. 34.50
Long in 30.50

Tuesday Oct. 6 1835

Commenced with strong gales at N.E.
ship heading S.W. at 2 P.M. light-
ly heading S.E. by E. under main top
and staysails and close main middle
part strong gales with rain latter part
wind E.N.E. and blowing strong thus
ends Lucas in sight
Lat in 30.23
Long in 31.00

Wednesday Oct. 7 1835

Commenced with strong gales at E.N.E.
middle and latter part moderate sighted
no right whales thus ends Lucas in sight
Lat in 37.23 S.
Long in 31.00 W.

Thursday Oct. 8 1835

First part moderate breezes at N.W.
ship heading South. at 1 P.M. sighted
2 right whales lowered in company with
Lucas and chased till 4 but did not
fasten at sunset shortened sail at
daylight made sail but see no right
whales ends with fresh breezes at S.W.
Lucas in sight Lat. in 37.50
Long in 31.05

Friday Oct. 9 1835

First part moderate breezes at S.W.
sighted no whales middle and latter part
some squally at 9 A.M. sighted a whale
lowered did not sight it from the
boat Lucas and 2 other ships in sight
thus ends Lat. in 38.05 Long in 31.10 west
