

Saturday Oct. 10 1835

These 24 fine weather wind Southward at 3 P.M. Spoke Ship Cisero Nantucket 80 Spinn 1 Right Whale also sighted a French Ship at 7 A.M. the Cisero Boats got fast lowered our Boats and Chased them then being 3 whales at 11 the Boats came on board the S.D. Ship took a whale Lucas in sight thus Ends

Lat. in 38° 08'

Long in 34° 00'

Sunday Oct. 11th 1835

These 24 hours light winds and variable first part sighted nothing but Humpbacks at 8 A.M. sighted a Right whale lowered and sunk the same thus Ends Lucas Cisero and a Frenchman in sight thus Ends

Lat. in 38° 27'

Long in 31° 15'

Monday Oct. 12 - 1835

These 24 hours fresh breezes and squally sighted several whales and lowered 3 times did not fasten thus Ends Lucas and Cisero in sight Lat. in 38° 53' Long in 31° 00'

Tuesday Oct. 13 1835

First part fresh winds at S.D.C. sighted whales and lowered did not fasten at 7 P.M. sighted one lowered and killed the same took it to the Ship and commenced cutting at noon finished thus Ends Lucas and Cisero in sight Lat. in 38° 48' Long in 30° 20'

Wednesday Oct. 14 1835

These 24 hours light breezes and calm sighted no Right Whales but many Humpbacks? Employed in boiling thus Ends Lucas & Cisero in sight

Lat. in 38° 51'

Long in 30° 30'

Thursday Oct. 15th 1835

These 24 hours light breezes and calm sighted no whales on the first part at 4 A.M. finished boiling at 9 A.M. sighted 2 whales lowered did not fasten at midday came on board thus Ends Lucas and Cisero in sight Lat. in 38° 40'

Long in 30° 30'

Friday Oct. 16th 1835

First part light breezes at the S.D.C. sighted the same 2 whales that we chased in the fore part of the day lowered and chased again but could not get fast middle and latter part strong gales at A.P. Ship heading N.E. Lucas and Cisero in sight Lat. in 38° 30' Long in 31° 00'

Saturday Oct. 17th 1835

These 24 hours strong gales S.E. Ship heading to the North under Main top sail staysails and reefed fore sail part of the 24 hours thus Ends Lucas and Cisero in sight

Lat. in 38° 30'

Long in 32° 30'
