

Friday Nov. the 13th 1835

first crew and me at 5 P.M.
took a whale a long side hooked
on but it being rigged let the
whale lay till morning latter
part rigged cut in the whale
Lucas in sight hauling thus ends

Lat. in 39.30

Long 19.50

Saturday Nov. 14

first part fresh crew at the N.W.
Employed in hauling latter part moderate
lighted a whale hauled at 10.30 took it
to the ship & commenced cutting
thus ends Lucas in sight

Lat. in 39.10

Long in 19.40

Sunday Nov. 15

these 24 hours fine weather finished cutting
the whale and took another along side
at 8 middle part employed in hauling
at 8 it was finished cutting in the whale
lighted another took it a long side at
10.30 saw the Lucas take one thus
ends

Lat. in 38.39

Long in 19.40

Monday Nov. 16

first part moderate breezes hauled in
the whale took in head &c and let the
body remain latter part cut it in saw
whales hauled and took one got one coat
stove employed in hauling hauling oil &c Lucas
in sight Lat. in 39.20 Long in 20.00

Tuesday Nov. 17 1835

first part fresh breezes at N.W. &c
Employed in hauling &c at 4 P.M.
Latter part took and killed the whale
at sunset took it to the ship
latter part strong gales the whale lying
along side all hands employed in
hauling and hauling away oil thus
ends Lucas in sight
wind North Lat. in 39.40
Long in 20.20

Wednesday Nov. 18

these 24 hours commence with strong
gales at the North middle part the
same latter part moderate wind from
S.W. cut in the whale &c thus ends
Lucas in sight Lat. in 39.55
Long in 20.30

Thursday Nov. 19

these 24 hours ~~fresh~~ breezes at
the North wind lighted no whales
near the ship employed in hauling
hauling away oil thus ends
Lucas in sight

Friday Nov. 20

strong gales at the N.W. &c latter
part moderate lighted whales at anchor
did not fasten thus ends finished hauling
at 2 A.M. Lucas in sight
