Monday Nov. 30th

Strong Gale at North. on the first
part at 11 P.M. the wind shifted
to the N.W. wore ship and headed
N.E. latter part Strong Gale at
W.N.W. Ship heading to the North
this ends Lat. in 39.32
Long by Est. 20.53

Tuesday Dec. 1 1835

Commences with Strong Gale at
the W.N.W. Ship heading S.E. middle
and latter part wind N.N.E. Sighted
nothing this ends Employed in
scraping bone Lat. in 40.17
Long in by Est. 19.40

Wednesday Dec. 2 Dec. 1835

First part Strong Gale at N.N.W.
Ship heading to the westward latter part
Strong Gale and veered Sighted one whale
but did not lower it being too rough
this ends repaired M. topsail
Lat. 40.15
Long 20.20

Thursday Dec. 3 " 1835

First part Strong Gale at the North Ship
heading E.N.E. latter part wind N.N.W.
Sighted no whales this ends Employed
in repairing fore sail Lat. in 40.08
Long in 19.45

Friday Dec. 4 1835

Strong breeze on the first part and
thick weather latter part moderate Sighted
no whales this concludes
Lat. in 39.39
Long in 19.50

Saturday Dec. 5 1835

Commences with Strong Gale
at west Sighted no whales latter
part very heavy wind and veered
Ship heading S.P.W. under Short
Pail this ends Employed in
repairing fore sail Lat. in 40.12
Long in 19.35

Sunday Dec. 6 1835

First part Strong Gale at the west
Ship heading S.P.W. under Short Sail
latter part moderate wind S.W. Ship
heading W.N.W. at 11 A.M. saw a Sail
this ends Lat. 40.29
Long 19.20
