

Wednesday Dec. 23

First part fresh breeze at N.W. at
Sighted whales lowered did not fasten
Saw the Lucas take whale at
7 A.M. finished coiling employed
in stowing down oil this ends
Lucas in sight Lat. in 38.00
Long in 17.45

Thursday Dec. 24

These 24 hours fresh gales at W.S.W.
Sighted whales lowered did not fasten
this ends employed in stowing down
oil Lucas in sight coiling
Lat. in 37.39
Long in 17.50

Friday Dec. 25

These 24 hours fresh gales at W.S.W.
Ship heading S.W. Sighted nothing
employed in scraping down this ends
Lucas in sight
Lat. in 38.09
Long in 18.00

Saturday Dec. 26th 1835

These 24 fresh breezes were thick weather
~~Spoke ship at 10 A.M. of 4 whales~~
Sighted one strong sail this ends
Lat. 37.57
Long in 17.30

Sunday Dec. 27 1835

First part fresh breeze and thick
weather Spoke ship at 10 A.M. of 4 whales
with 11 whales latter part sighted whales
lowered got fast to one whale and killed another
this ends Lat. in 38.00 Long in 17.30

Monday Dec. 28th 1835

First part fresh breeze at N.W. at
2 P.M. took a whale to the ship then
sail at 2 A.M. parted chain flukes
at 8 A.M. took along side again ends
with strong breeze at S.W. and roused
this ends Lucas in sight
Lat. in 38.22
Long in 17.15

Tuesday Dec. 29

First part strong gales at S.W. Ship
lying by the whale at 4 P.M. parted
chain again held the whale by a cutting
fall till we got the cable on latter
part more moderate cut in the whale
and commenced coiling this ends
Lucas in sight Lat. 38.03
Long in 17.50

Wednesday Dec. 30

First part fresh breeze at S.W.
Ship heading N.W. by S. Sighted 2 whales
lowered did not fasten latter part
strong gales with rain this ends
Lucas in sight Lat. 37.40
Long 18.20

Thursday Dec. 31

Commenced with strong breeze at the S.W.
but moderating at 2 P.M. Sighted whales
lowered did not fasten at 3 lowered again
struck and killed two one scum took the
other at the ship at midnight latter part
cut her in this ends Lucas in sight cutting
Lat. in 37.50 Long in 18.00
